Q: What are three important issues facing Greenwich voters today?

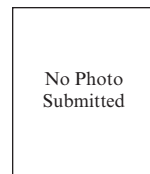

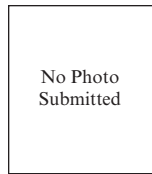
